
DIRECT INSTRUCTION W FEEDBACK

COMBINE STRATEGIES FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

Direction instruction is the explicit teaching of a sequenced curriculum of knowledge and skills, with cumulative practice and feedback that informs of one student progress.

Feedback is used to clarify, inform and guide one in understanding the knowledge or skills needed to meet a goal or target.



"Feed-up ensures that students understand the purpose of the assignment, task, or lesson, including how they will be assessed. Feedback provides students with information about their successes and Feed-forward guides student learning based on performance data. All three are required if students are to learn at high levels.
